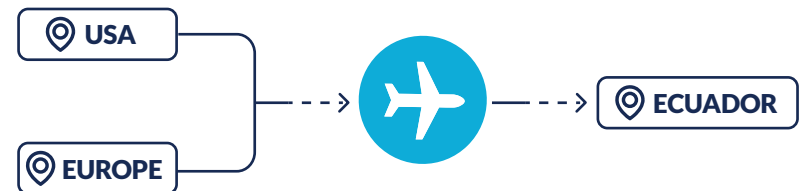

Where are the Galapagos Islands, and how do I get there?

- The Galapagos Islands are part of **Ecuador**, located approximately **600 mi (1,000 km)** off the mainland, in **South America**.
- **19 islands** and dozens of islets make up the Galapagos. The archipelago and its Marine Reserve have a total area of 51,352 mi² (133, 000 km²) of ocean and around 3,040 mi² (7,880 km²) of land.
- **Direct flights** from the **USA** to **Ecuador** include **Miami, Houston, Atlanta**, and more. **Flights from Europe: Madrid, Amsterdam**.
- There are **two airports in Galapagos** you can fly to: **Seymour Airport (GPS)** on Baltra Island and **San Cristobal Airport (SCY)** on San Cristobal Island.
- Keep in mind that you'll need to spend an overnight in either Quito or Guayaquil before flying to the Galapagos. **Flights depart early in the morning**.

- 97% of the Galapagos Islands comprises the highly protected **Galapagos National Park**. **Inhabited areas** in the Galapagos only represent **3%** of the entire archipelago.
- When you visit the Galapagos National Park, you will see species in their natural habitats.
- When exploring the Galapagos National Park, visitors must be accompanied by **certified naturalist guides**.
- Whether traveling on an expedition yacht or a smaller “day tour”-style vessel, **Park rules are in place to preserve the integrity and natural beauty of the Galapagos' unique ecosystems.**

When is the best time to go and how long should I stay?

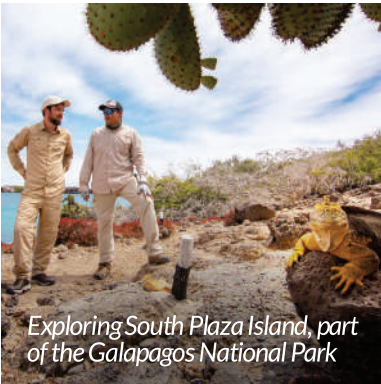
- Because the Galapagos archipelago straddles the Equatorial Line; a **perfect year-round destination**.
- **As there are only two seasons in the Galapagos, Dry and Hot.** So one can enjoy the islands and view fascinating species any time of the year!
- To adequately explore and enjoy the Galapagos, visitors should **plan to spend at least 4 nights**.

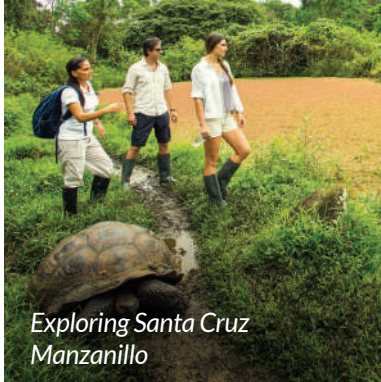
Should I hop on a cruise or stay at a hotel?

Expedition Yacht:



- Expedition vessels offer more than twice as much access to exclusive visitor sites in the **Galapagos National Park**.
- Multiple park-approved activities include **hiking, snorkeling, paddle-boarding, swimming, kayaking, and glass-bottom boat rides**.
- The **guest-space ratio (GSR)** is 28. This means ample space for guests to relax, socialize, and enjoy amenities without feeling crowded.
- Each vessel has its own **medical officer** available **24/7** to provide immediate help and coordinate further medical actions.

- Day tours to nearby islands pair land exploration with opportunities for swimming and snorkeling.
- Visitors have flexibility and on-site activity options.
- Land-based options offer time to enjoy the hotel facilities and interact with local people and culture.
- Available activities include kayaking, paddleboarding, snorkeling, hiking, biking, and scuba diving (some require an additional fee).

Pro tip: To make the most of your visit to the Galapagos, consider spending a few days at a land-based hotel before or after an expedition cruise.

Brief Steps for Choosing the Best Itinerary for Your Galapagos Cruise Package

- **Step 1:** Given the size of the Galapagos and the distance between each island, traveling through the entire archipelago is impossible. So, ask your destination expert about the must-see islands to plan the minimum number of days you need to include them in your itinerary.

All of our itineraries last the minimum recommended of 5 days, enough time to experience each piece of the archipelago without feeling rushed.

- **Step 2:** The Galapagos Islands are one of the most important biodiversity hotspots in the world and have some of the highest levels of endemism.

That's why we always recommend that our guests take the time to consider which animals they want to see when choosing their itinerary.

Be sure to check out our full **Big 15** list of iconic Galapagos species!

Some itineraries include seeing: the flightless cormorant, red-footed boobies, the Galapagos albatross, the Santa Fe land iguana.

- **Step 3:** One of the main reasons going on Galapagos tours is so appealing is simply due to the geological distinctiveness of each island.

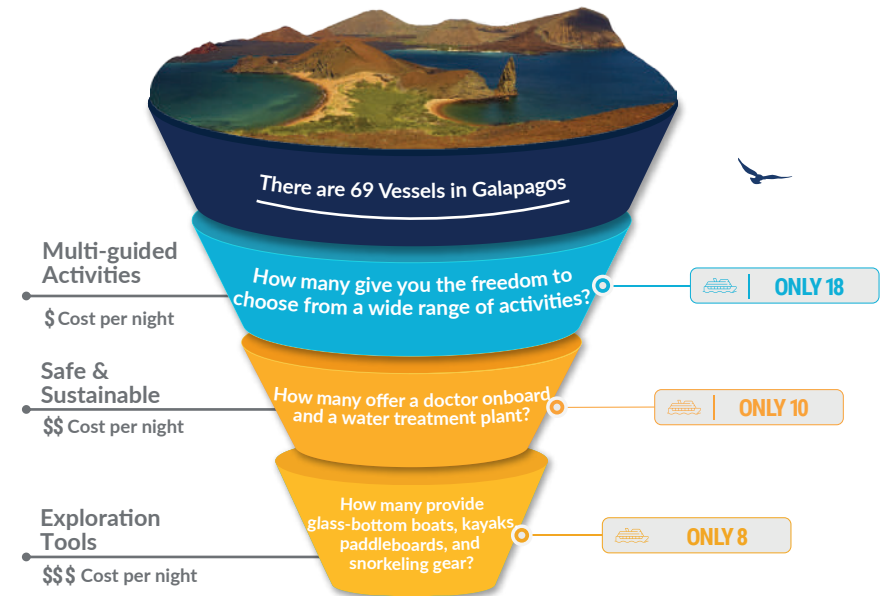
